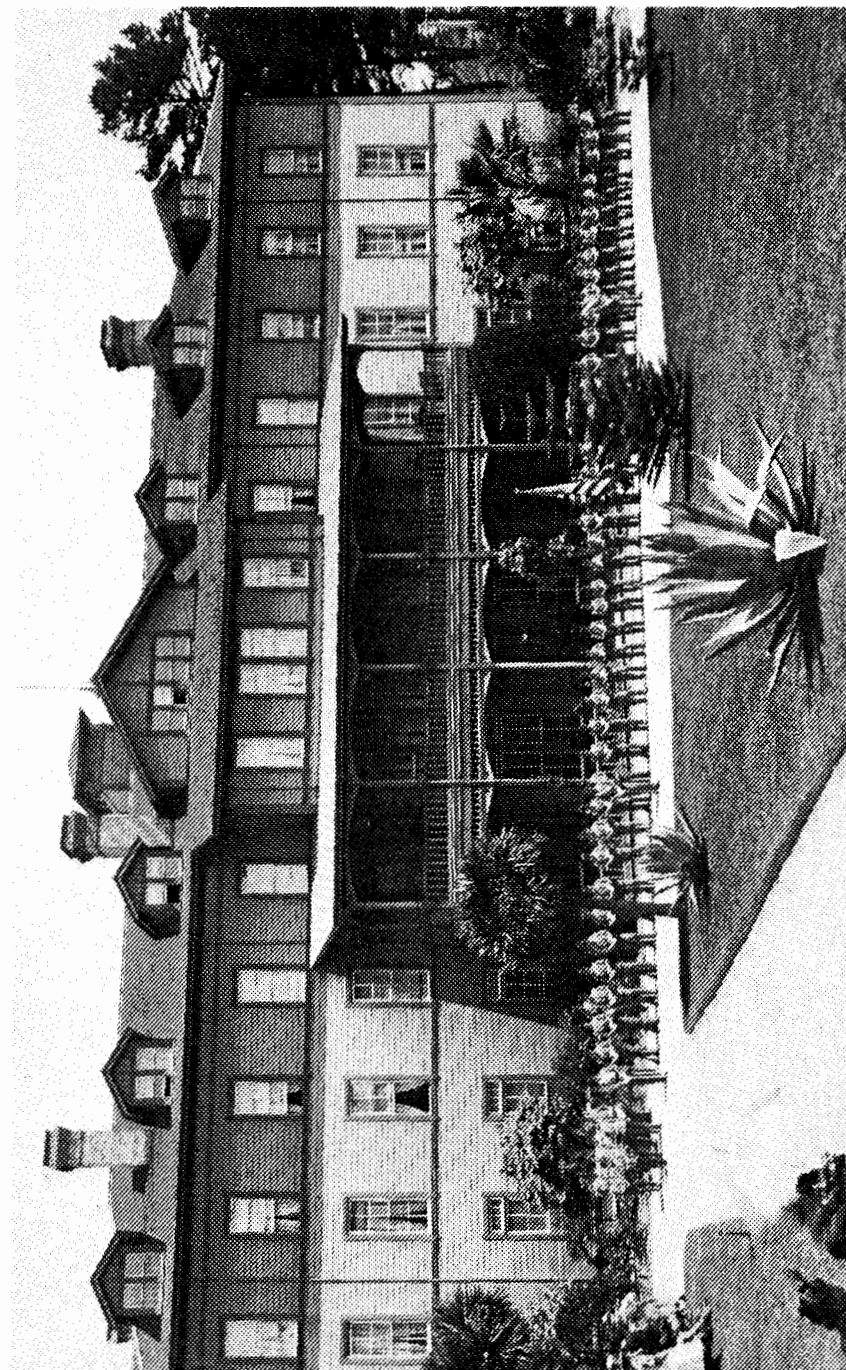
Board Resignation

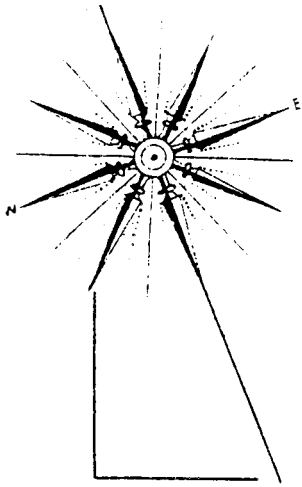

El Carmelo/Pacific Grove Hotel

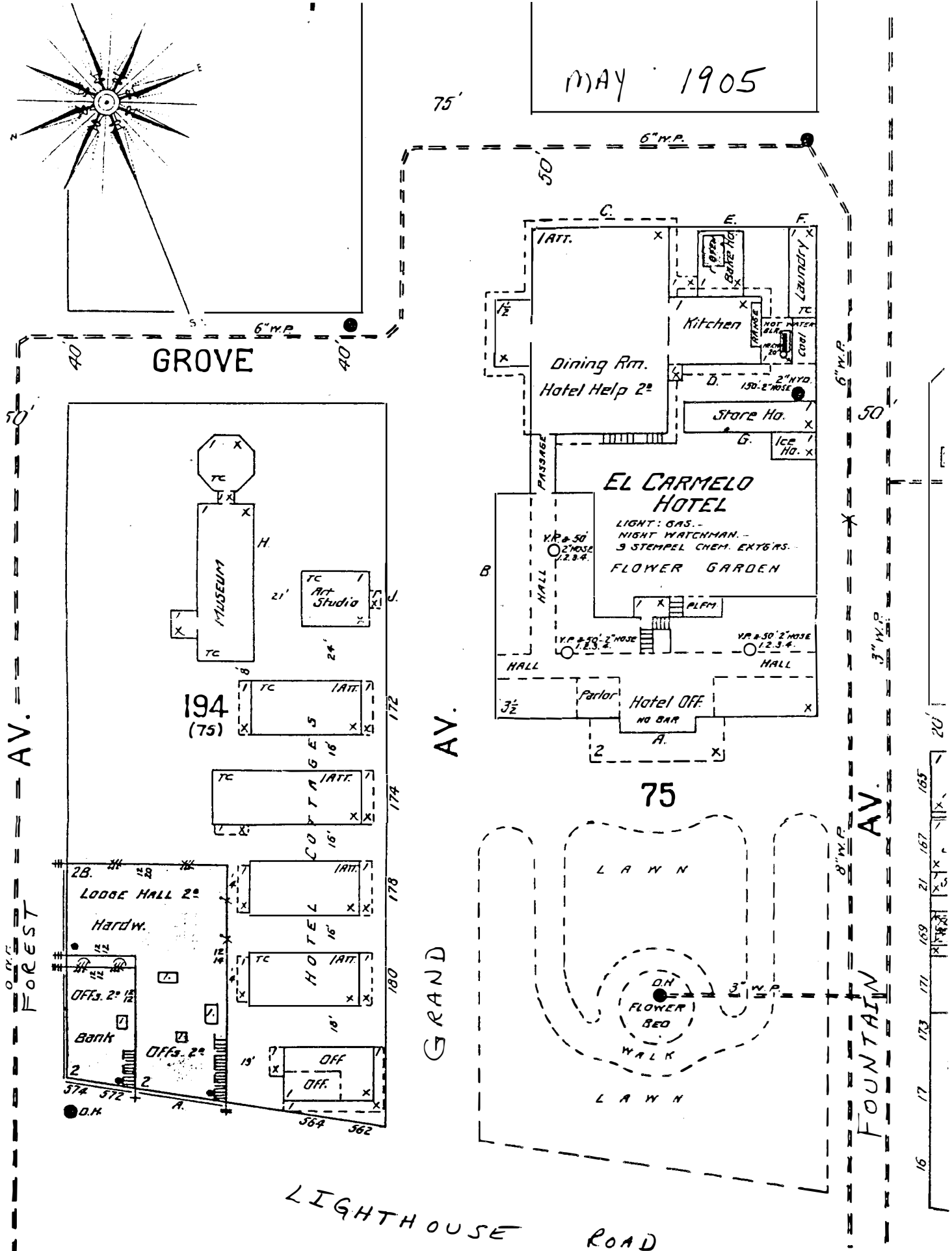
The El Carmelo Hotel, Pacific Grove's first building of true hotel pattern, officially opened to guests on May 20, 1887. It was located on Lighthouse between Fountain and Grand where Holman's now stands. It was built by the Pacific Improvement Company and included six cottages across the street on Grand Avenue which were built earlier in 1883. It was three stories high plus an attic and contained 114 rooms along with broad staircases and many means of exit and entrance. Every room was plumbed with Carmel River water and lighted with gas manufactured on the premises. It enjoyed some measure of success, especially after the Del Monte Hotel in Monterey burned in late 1887, even though wine could not be served to guests as was the custom at the Del Monte.

Around 1910, the name of the El Carmelo Hotel was changed to the Pacific Grove Hotel to avoid any confusion with the new town of Carmel. Finally in 1918, the hotel was taken down and its lumber was used to help build the Del Monte Lodge in Pebble Beach. In 1924, Holman's Department Store was constructed on the site. Recipe

The following is from a book published around 1909 containing recipes of many of the women in Pacific Grove, Monterey, Salinas, etc.

Nasturtium Salad

First sprinkle flowers at night-fall so that every particle of dust is washed away. Early in the morning while the dew is on, gather the latest blossoms and tenderest leaves, and put in a cool place until wanted. Prepare a dressing as follows:

1/2 cupful of vinegar
1 teaspoon of mustard
1 teaspoon of salt
Yolks of three eggs
Butter size of an egg

Mix and cook until thick. When cool add a cupful of whipped cream. Serve by placing the flowers and leaves on plates and adding one teaspoonful of dressing.
