# Do you know

About Chautauqua Hall? It is reputed to be the oldest building in Pacific Grove. It was used as a religious meeting house and had a belfry and a huge bell. It was also used as a concert hall, featuring classical music and popular "trios" and well-known lecturers, William Jennings Bryant being one of them. The Retreaters also had their own talent, the men's chorus rendering such sterling tunes as, "The Bullfrog On The Bank", "Polly Wolly Doodle", "Ben Bolt". A poetic fellow wrote, "The most sacred center in the whole Chautauqua world is the Hall in the Grove. It is not far thence to Heaven".
